Our shelter, **with your help**, is one of the few **safe places on Samui** for the poor (former) strays.

Unfortunately we cannot accommodate all four-legged friends on the island,
hence our many projects at the many **temples** on the island,
at the **old pier in Ban Kao** or wherever an animal is in need.

Every day we receive messages from injured or sick dogs,
which we then pick up immediately or have brought to us for Dr.

To be able to have Dr. Sith and his team treated!

Thank you all again for making it possible for us to **save many fur noses from certain death!**

It is great for our dogs and cats that many visitors from the island, but also from all over the world, find their way back to us. Tourists, guests, long-time supporters and many friends are now coming almost every day to give our 4-legged friends pets and cuddles. We are very happy about donations in kind, such as food and collars as well as tools, building materials etc. and financial support so that we can pay for medicine, wages, food etc.!

Visitors are welcome every day!

We are there **7 days a week** and look forward to everyone which finds its way to us
in Chaweng and also in Ban Taling Ngam.

Unfortunately, the situation is of course not the same as it was before the pandemic began,
as many hotels and resorts on Samui are still closed.

Here are some of our visitors since April 22 in Ban Taling Ngam and Chaweng:





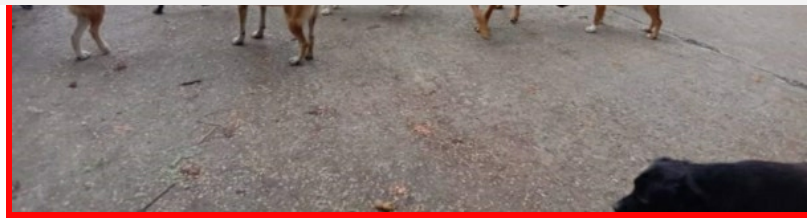

One of our puppies is now allowed to live with Christine in Canada.



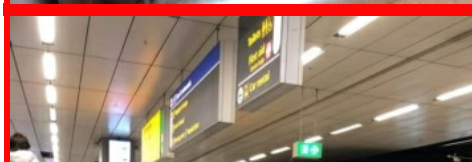
Here is the great story of "Hiu":

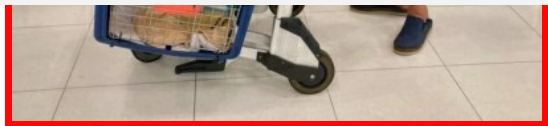

(Bangkok Airways still doesn't take larger dogs unfortunately)

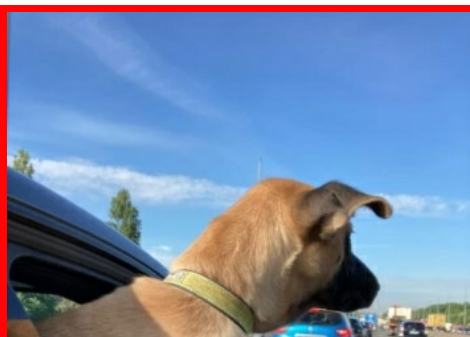
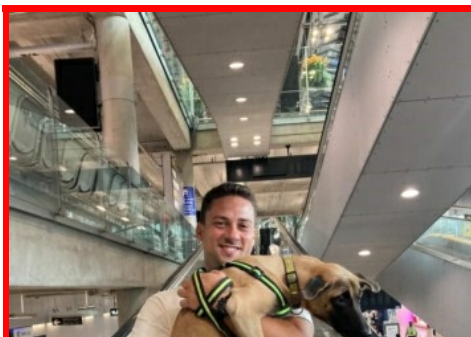
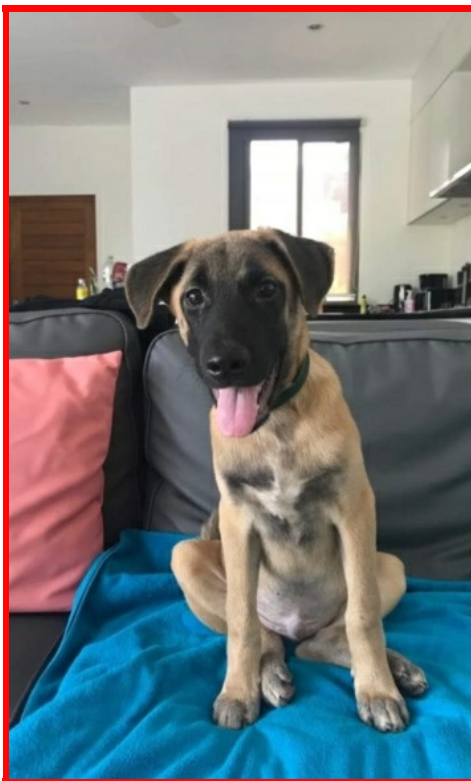
We are all so happy for Hiu and so proud that he has found **such a great home in Germany!**

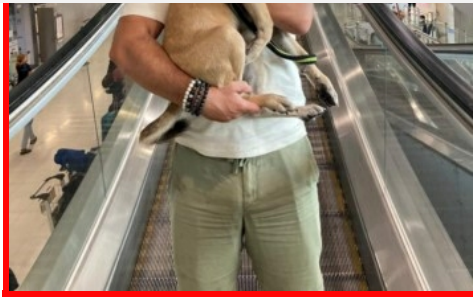

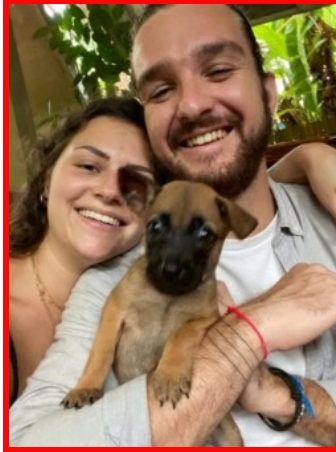


Another great story: Arkoh, born on Samui, now **lives in Paris/ France:**





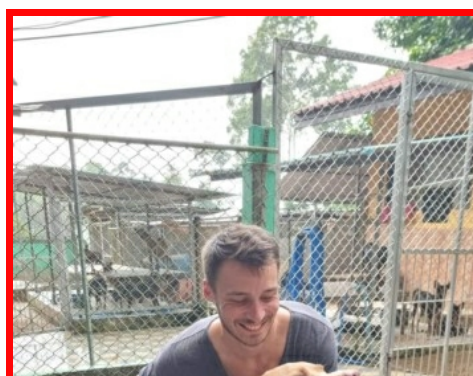
...and **Albis** was adopted by Enzo and his partner and have given him a beautiful home here on the island

that they have **constant visitors, staff** with them.

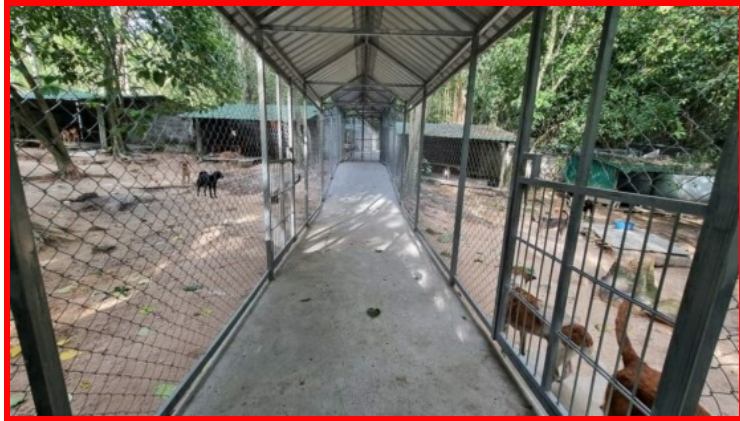
Also Dr. Sith and his team have it much easier now, check the dogs and treat them if necessary.

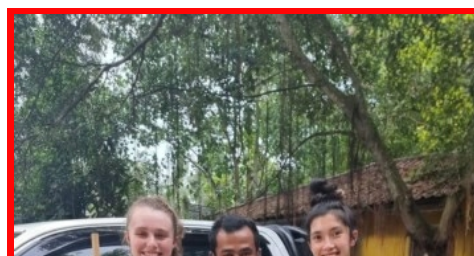
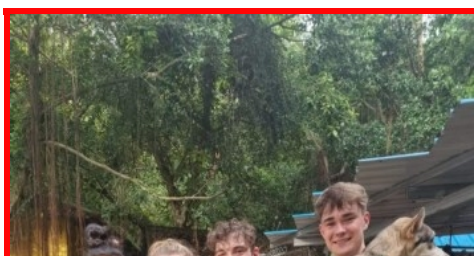


For the first time after Corona, we had **4 prospective veterinarians from Ireland** again as volunteers for several weeks.

Unfortunately, bad cases of dogs and cats still come to us every day.

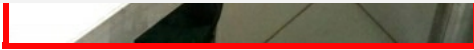
I want to spare you worse pictures. Dr. Sith and his team really **tirelessly do a great job for the poor strays** out there!

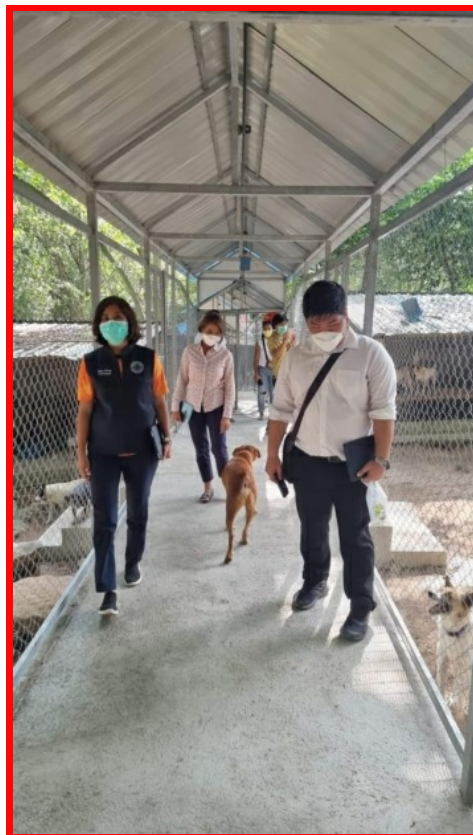




Koh Samui's Deputy Mayor Deputy Major Ms. Supinya Srithongkul and her team visited our shelter on 07.06.2022.

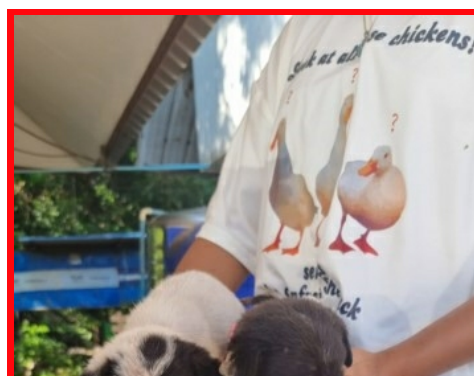


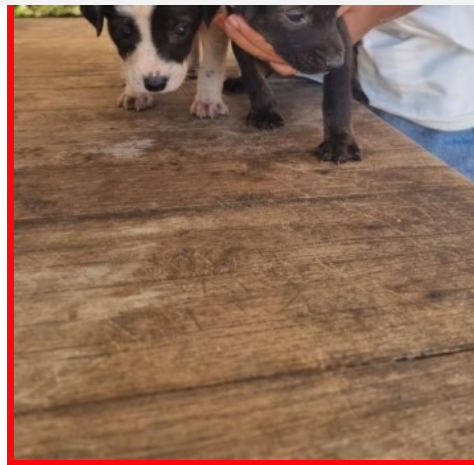


We had been made aware that there were **about 20 dogs at Raja Pier on the mainland in Don Sak** are in a **bad condition** . We decided without further ado to help **with food and medicine on site**.

We found, among other things, **2 almost starved babies**, which we of course **took with us to Samui** to have her there by Dr. to have Sith treated.

We will continue to help there on site in the future, because I think that our commitment to animal welfare does not have to end at Samui's borders!





Of course, we **not only feed and take care of our 400 dogs and 100 cats** every day at the two locations Chaweng and Ban Taling Ngam, **but also hundreds at the temples of Koh Samui.**

There I post current articles about the Dog Rescue Center and the island of Koh Samui every day.

Unfortunately, the exchange rate between Euro and Thaibaht **is developing catastrophically** for us because of the Ukraine war. **We lose about 5 and 10%** when exchanging from Euro to Thai Baht compared to last year!

Please remember, the poor dogs and kittens almost always only have us and wait the whole day for their food ration and a few cuddles!

A 20 kg feed bag costs around 20 euros!

Please continue to help us so that we can give the poor strays a life here.

We are very happy about sponsorships for the dear souls in our shelter who couldn't find a place to survive on the street!

Thanks to everyone for your constant commitment to animal welfare!!! Without you we could never carry out these treatments and feedings and thus save the lives of many fur noses every day!

Please continue to support us so that we can continue Brigitte's life's work!
