Dear animal friends!

December 2019

Another year has passed and the work for the dogs and cats is not getting less. My very sincere thanks to all who have supported us for all these years.

Hopefully, any of you who visited us for the first time this year could also convince themselves of our tireless work for the dogs and cats. We would be very happy if you would continue to support us from afar. Without YOU, I would have only dreamed my dream and who knows if someone else would have dedicated his life to the animals here.

Help from the island is almost non-existent. It's the complete opposite- many foreigners who are established here, have an incredibly high standard of expectations and expect us to jump immediately and fulfill their wishes when it comes to an injured dog or cat. Of course, it should also be done for free. Since the treatment of Thai animals is free of charge, foreign men like to send their Thai wives. Incredible- there is always enough money for a beer, but they are too stingy to pay a vaccination once a year.

VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS ARE ALWAYS WELCOME

Visitors are always welcome! No prior registration is required! In Chaweng we are open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. At the shelter in Baan Taling Ngam we are open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Unfortunately, we do not always have someone to guide you around at the shelter. The Thai staff speaks only a little English.

Of course, I'm also at the shelter but I don't have any fixed scheduled days.

Just have a look around and have fun with the nearly 350 dogs. You can go to any enclosure. Please close the doors when you visit the dogs there. Often there is also a volunteer who is sure to take you around. Since 6 weeks **Joelle** helps at the cat house regularly. She likes to show you everything and tell you what we do for the animals. You will surely find her in the cat house or nearby. She speaks German, French, Italian, English and Swiss.

Everyone, large or small, likes puppies. I also love puppies, but take a look at the chair in the picture. That's how all my furniture would look if I took them into my house. They also gnawed a leg of a dresser overnight until it fell off. Fortunately, it has 6 legs and is now is still doing quite well on 5 legs. We have never had so many puppies as this year.









Marcus always monitors the large enclosures at the shelter and checks, if all dogs have enough dry food and fresh water.

He also helps with repairs and likes to work with our other long-term volunteer **Markus**.

Vadim immediately intervened and was able to save Jack. They have also threatened him with clear gestures. The traders who sell pictures with monkeys or reptiles are the worst. They shoot the mothers to get the baby monkeys.

REPAIR WORKS AT THE ANIMAL SHELTER

A small storm and again a dog hut is destroyed.

In the meantime, almost all dog accommodations were covered with plastic sheets. They often only get bumps and are almost always reusable.

Before we used Eternit plates, which ware always broken into 1000 pieces. Some huts still have the old roof structure made of bamboo poles. These are always getting renewed when the storm makes a roof fly away again.

We thought that bamboo poles are a good solution for the roof construction. Unfortunately, this turned out to be a mistake because we simply cannot win the aggressive attacks of termites. The do not like steel beams, but we have to fight against the rust in this case.





We don't just have to fight with branches and leaves. The last Eternit roof tiles, which have not yet been replaced by the new plastic roof tiles, also cause a lot of work when they get destroyed by falling branches.





This is a dog hut in front of the animal shelter. We often get visits from dogs that have discovered the feeding station. Making a fire seems to bring great joy to Thais. Everyone is always enthusiastic about it. The trees and bushes grow incredibly fast and once we cut everything at the shelter, we can start all over again....



The fight against ticks continues. If a particularly large amount of ticks have attacked the dogs again, we spray all enclosures with Baiticol



Ticwash.That definitely helps a bit. We cannot afford SIMPARICA for all shelter dogs. Once a month, all of our dogs are treated with Frontline. They also get Ivomec for deworming and ticks.

CONSULTATION IN CHAWENG

Every Tuesday and Friday from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. **Dr. Sith** is at my house in Chaweng to carry out consultations.

As you can see, the opportunity to get free treatment for dogs and cats is used by a lot of Thais. We always ask for donations, of course, but those who have no money cannot donate. Of course, all animals are treated and get medicine.



Since cats without a box were brought to treatment again and again, we had to put this sign outside.

It says that cats are not getting treated without a box. We have about 20 wild dogs in front of the house!





Wit, our manager, helps **Dr. Sith** with the treatments. Often it's just about vaccinations ... Dr. Sith wuld not be able to treat the many Thais seeking for help for their animals in only one hour. His two helpers also diligently give vaccinations or prepare the doctors prescribed medicine for the patients.







The consultation hour is almost exclusively visited by Thais with their dogs and cats.

The foreigners residing on the island prefer to call and expect us to pick up their dogs and cats for treatment or would like me to send a helper to their home to vaccinate them.

Hardly a day goes by, for me not to be annoyed by the outrageous demands of some foreigners living here. They want everything immediately and of course free of charge. If I don't immediately fulfill their wishes, they will write poorly about us in Facebook. If it wasn't for the animals, I would reject any treatment of dogs and cats from foreigners based here.

OAN



ROBBIE is back home with his family.

His real name is **OAN** and he is already 15 years old. He was brought to us because he was helplessly walking the street.

He is blind. We called him Robbie. He immediately felt comfortable with us. His family, who lives in Lamai, had looked for him everywhere.



In the end, they decided to take a picture of their darling to the large shelter in Baan Taling Ngam and ask if they had seen their dog.

Lek, a member of our staff, told them Robby (Oan) is in my house in Chaweng.

The reunion was great and Oan cried out of joy. They have had Oan since he was a puppy and you could see that they love their dog.

We are happy with Oan and his family and wish them many happy years together.

STRUPPIE



This is Struppie from the Fairhouse Beach Resort on Chaweng Noi Beach. She always needs a new haircut. The last one was not that long ago, so she still looked guite passable. Of course, she ran away seeing us again and the first attempt to catch failed. Unfortunately, the animal friends never believe me when I tell them that Struppie will immediately leave when she sees one of our helpers. Often she will not be seen for a while then. Once we have her, she patiently takes the new haircut...

ANNA and BUBU.

were left with us by a German Anna is 7 years old and Bubu is 9 already. He already had the two as puppies. He went back to Germany and was not interested in taking them with him. Unfortunately, this is not an isolated case. Some simply leave their dogs and cats on the street and are gone forever... The two were lucky that they were handed over to us. They had only little chance of survival on the street.

Since we have no other news for **Instagram** than for **Facebook**, Alisa has agreed to take care of the posting on Instagram. We are very grateful for that. She can answer most questions and if it gets complicated she will consult me.

FACEBOOK

I now have almost 5,000 "friends" on my FB profile **Brigitte Gomm**. Almost all of them have something to do with animals. You can imagine how many terrible messages are posted there daily. I stopped checking FB in the evening's long time ago because I often cannot get the fertile pictures of the tortured animals out of my head.

I have also signed out from the group **"Dog and cats on Koh Samui"** in Facebook a long time ago.. There were and still are bad comments about our work. The time is too short for me to deal with alleged animal friends who only make demands and are not willing to give any real help. I know what Dr. Sith with his Thai helpers and our long-term volunteers achieve daily and I don't have any interest or time to deal with people from the island who don't have the slightest idea what we do for the dogs and cats each day.

FLIGHT VOLUNTEERS

We are always looking for flight volunteers for our shelter dogs and for other dogs that have managed to convince an animal lover that they absolutely have to take them with them. Otherwise they would face an uncertain future at the beach in front of a bungalow complex or wherever on Koh Samui.

The dogs are waiting for their departure at our shelter, if possible with flight volunteers, because freight transport costs a lot more.

These airlines transport dogs on particularly favorable terms: Aeroflot, Lufthansa, KLM, AUA, and AirFrance.

Thai Airways is a bit more expensive, but is well suited for dogs that are not too heavy. Unfortunately, a bigger problem has arisen because the transfer time in Bangkok is too short for almost all animal friends who have agreed to take dogs as flight volunteers.

It takes at least 3 hours of stay in Bangkok, because the luggage will not be checked through if you want to check in a dog in Bangkok. So the luggage has to be checked in again in Bangkok. Then there is passport control, where it is often very busy.

So only those animal friends , who spend a few days in Bangkok at the end of their vacation or who have enough transfer time are considered as flight volunteers.





PLEASE CONTACT ME IF YOU WANT TO HELP TO MAKE A DOG A HAPPY LIFE!

On Koh Samui, with YOUR help, every dog and cat has had the opportunity to receive medical treatment for free for over 20 years.

For stray animals that cannot survive on Koh Samui alone, there is the possibility of being taken in at the shelter. With your help, at least 6 animals can still be neutered every day. Thanks to your donations in the past few months, we have not yet had to make any cuts to our spaying and neutering program. Within the past 20 years, over 25,000 dogs and cats have been neutered and innumerable vaccinations and treatments have been carried out.

We offer free medical treatments for ALL stray dogs and cats. Dogs and cats that have a Thai owner receive all treatments free of charge. Medicines are very cheap in Thailand and we expect foreigners to make a small contribution to the treatment of their dog or cat. If you come for treatment with a stray dog, the treatment is of course free of charge. In the past few months, due to the financial state of emergency, we have had to ask Thais for a contribution to medical treatment, which means, they should pay for the medication, if possible. Everyone paid for medicine according to their options. It also helped to bridge our financial situation.

However, I'm afraid that if we no longer receive regular donations, we will again face a major problem at the end of January and I will have to think about possible savings measures again. I fired a helper and one of them no longer came to work on his own.

I can't lay off more helpers. Repairs are now almost impossible. Only when all the helpers are at work, there is something going on.



If you order from Zooplus.de or Amazon.de, we get between 3.5 and 8.5% of your purchase amount transferred to our account.

I would be happy if you would do your shopping with us. Please click on the logo on the German homepage of the homepage **www.samuidog.org** We get about 200 euros credited through your purchases every month.

We also registered with **GOODING**.

Similar to Amazon, GOODING has a lot of shops on offer. Just have a look.

We have also been registered with **BILDUNGSSPENDER** for a long time.

All four give us a percentage if you order something there. Which provider is the cheapest for you, you might have a look. There are certainly a lot of similar facilities out there, but I don't think there is need for more. They all have the same shops on offer.

Of course, new dogs and cats are taken to the shelter because they have not found a place to survive alone during the last months.
