


TEMPLE PROJECT August 2014

In October 2007, the DRCS started providing dog and cat food for many of Samuis´ temples. In April 2008, the Temple Project-Team (Jay, Linda & Tom) started to not only give food but also vaccinate and provide medical attention to dogs and cats. If absolutely necessary, the injured or sick animal is brought to the shelter for further treatments. Our work includes a lot of street work and many little villages surrounding the temples.

With the right medication and of course something for the pain, Maa started eating again, put on weight and the wounds were healing fast......




In this lovely Temple-House Maa had a peaceful place to recover with the best care possible....

...and finally, <u>Thanks</u> to all of you, we could order the first wheelchair for Maa.....








Linda was just as nervous when she put Maa in the wheelchair for the first time....

...and then...first time alone...... It works! Maa is almost faster than Jay.....










We sat together with Oh (Maa's friend and caretaker) and the Monks and talked everything through...

KNOW HOW TO TREAT AN ANIMAL!



We've been working at Samui-Temples for many years and know each and every dog at the Temples we provide with food and medication. Of course also the relation with the monks has improved a lot and very often they come and show us new or injured animals as soon as we drive into the temple.

Since very often there is a school right next to a temple, many times we thought how important it would be to educate young Thai Children in how to treat (and NOT treat) animals – especially stray animals. So we were happy to see how the monk sat down with all the kids who spent a couple of weeks at this temple in Nathon and taught them about our work as well as general behavior with and towards dogs.





WHAT A DONATION!

We have already informed you that people react very differently to dogs who are wearing collars than to those who are not. We have several hundred dogs collectively in all the temples we treat and since they have a tendency to wander out in the evening we decided that we would like to provide every one of them with a collar.

Every month we deliver over 1,000 kg! of dog and cat food to the temples




Beside our almost 20




